When you use a Keyword or "Any Field" search you will get results with those words in the record. This will broaden your search but if you wish to find information on a specific religion or aspect of world religions you will want to use a subject search.



Periodical Databases / Articles

Databases that will assist in your search are:

Academic Search Premier = General Information
Psychology and Behavioral Sciences Collection
SocINDEX with Full Text

The MOST helpful databases for your search are:

ATLA Religion Database with ATLASerials = It might be best to use this database for "primary" sources. It indexes materials written by practitioners of various religions, not just from the Protestant perspective. Christian Periodical Index = You will get a mostly Protestant perspective on world religions from this database but the information will definitely be worthwhile.



Websites

http://www.bbc.co.uk/religion/religions/ = The BBC is a fairly trusted news source worldwide. However, as with any other news media the information gained from this source must be carefully evaluated. . I first looked at "Christianity" to get a sense of how the subject was presented and found it to be a simplistic view of the various religions.

<u>http://www.hds.harvard.edu/cswr/resources/index.html</u> = Resource page for the Center for the Study of World Religions at Harvard University. Contains lectures, performances, and other materials on various topics related to world religions.

<u>http://www.artsmia.org/world-religions/</u> = Website for the Minneapolis Institute of Art. Allows people to view the history of the five major world religions, along with corresponding art and artifacts from various time periods. Entries about religions are stated to have been reviewed by clergy members of each faith, and the art/artifacts are described by museum curators.

<u>https://www.cia.gov/library/publications/the-world-factbook/</u> = CIA World FactBook. Contains statistics for all countries of the world, including religion.

A great tool for searching for various statistics on world religions, including: number of adherents, religious freedom, effects of government on religion, public opinion, etc. Also contains background information related to various statistics. Data and information is managed by the University of Pennsylvania and submitted by religion scholars and researchers.
