Children's Catalog – SERIAL 011.62 C437 (Located on the index tables behind REF sec.)

• Index to children's literature organized by author, title, and subject.

The Continuum Encyclopedia of Children's Literature – REF 809.89282 C767 and The Continuum Encyclopedia of Young Adult Literature – REF 809.89282 C767 2005

Author articles combine biographical information, awards, and critical commentary.
 Listings following each article include awards (not comprehensive), additional works, and biographical references.

Dictionary of American Children's Fiction – REF 809.89282 H366 and Dictionary of American Young Adult Children's Fiction, 1997-2001 – REF 809.89282 H366 2004

- This series includes only those books that have received awards or have been placed on citation lists during the period represented in each volume (volumes cover 1859-1999). Look up the author's name for biographical entries. Look up the book title for plot summary, brief critical commentary, and award information.
- Asterisked book titles in author entries appear as their own entry.

Junior Authors & Illustrators – REF 809.89282 J959

 Entries include both autobiographical and biographical sketches. A selected works list and bibliography follow each article. The comprehensive index is located in the 7th Book (1996).

The Oxford Encyclopedia of Children's Literature – REF 809-89282 Ox2

• This set contains brief introductions to authors and their works. The cumulative index is located in the last volume.

St. James Guide to Children's Writers – REF 809.89282 Sa25 and St. James Guide to Young Adult Writers – REF 809.89282 Sa25y

• Entries include biographical facts, lists of publications, and award information. Autobiographical comments occasionally appear.

The Undergraduate's Companion to Children's Writers and Their Web Sites – REF 809.89282 St47

Each entry includes a list of web sites and citations for biographical and critical works.
 Use this source carefully, as the audience level for some of the web sites and critical essays may be below college scholarly level.

This is not an exhaustive list of resources—this is only a starting point. Other notable resources are located in the reference section at 809.89282. As you will notice above, many young adult authors are also discussed in works about children's authors.

 MLA is the subject database for literature, which indexes articles about authors and their works.

 - o The subdivision "Criticism and interpretation" indicates the item is about the author's works (ex: Paterson, Katherine—Criticism and interpretation).
