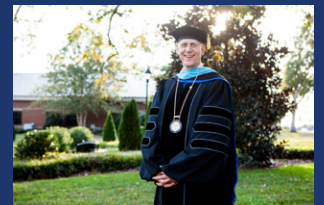

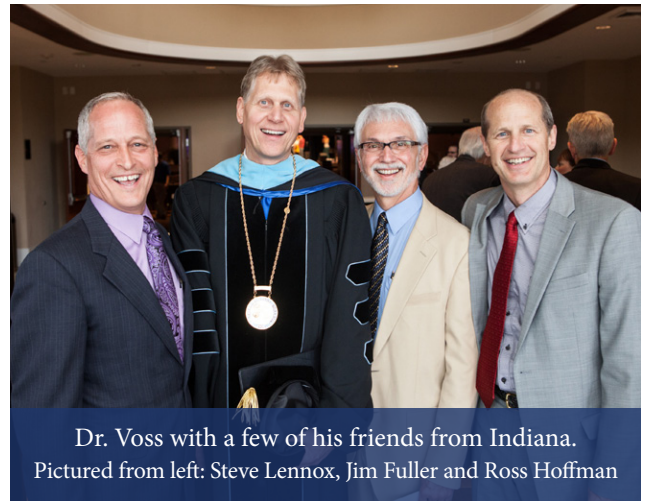

COMING TO A CHANNEL NEAR YOU: SWU GRAD BRUSHES WITH FAME

Phillip Fritts, a 2009 media communication graduate, has had quite a few brushes with fame.

During the 2008 presidential campaign, Phillip was a student at Southern Wesleyan and managed to meet and get autographs from most of the Republican hopefuls, which included Mitt Romney, John McCain, Mike Huckabee and Ron Paul. He even met actor Chuck Norris, who was also on the campaign trail.

Since those days, he has been keeping busy developing and growing phillipfritts.com, a website filled with interesting people he has interviewed and information presented in an entertaining format. To date, the site has had visitors from 100 different countries. “Ever since I was little, I have enjoyed asking questions,” said Phillip. “Just talk with my parents, Garry and Mary Anne Fritts.” For the site, he has interviewed celebrities and other well-known people, including Ed Asner, Kimberly Estrada, Bob Timberlake and Pat Robertson. He has also interviewed people with unfamiliar names, including Bob Bergen, who voiced Looney Tunes character Porky Pig. One of his favorite interviews was with Carol Spinney, who has voiced and performed Big Bird and Oscar the Grouch since the first episode of Sesame Street in 1969.

New doors continue to open for Phillip, who with his wife, Mandi Bedell Fritts, a 2011 human services SWU graduate, traveled to New York and taped a Newlywed Game show for the new season on GSN. “Celebrity Host Sherri Shepherd even popped into the Green Room to meet us before the show began,” Phillip said. The couple had concerns about the type of questions they would be asked and prayed about it. They were assured by Newlywed Game producers that they were trying to ask more family-friendly questions.

Mandi was amazed at the amount of work that goes into taping a 30-minute episode. “It was neat to see the entire crew pitch in and do their part,” she said. “As contestants on the show, we are unable to reveal whether we won or not until the actual episode airs on television Jan. 3, 2013 at 8:00 p.m. It’s been a lot of fun keeping friends and family in the dark, building their anticipation for the episode release.”

Phillip and Mandi were also selected as background actors in a restaurant scene on the USA Network show *Necessary Roughness*. “While it was a restaurant scene and we did have food in front of us, we were not able to eat it since the food would need to appear the same throughout all of the shots. No one wants to eat an eight-hour-old salmon fillet. We were starving by the end of the day,” Phillip said.

As a SWU student, Phillip participated in student productions, including *Joseph* and the *Technicolor Dreamcoat*, saying the experiences gave him a confidence boost. “I remember walking across campus to my first audition for the *Technicolor* production. I was so nervous that I literally stopped walking and considered not even showing up for the audition. I fought the urge to quit and kept walking toward the audition,” Phillip said. “I am not sure I would have pursued other challenging roles, had I skipped that SWU audition.”

Phillip is the guest services event coordinator for The Billy Graham Training Center at The Cove in Asheville, N.C. Prior to that, he worked for Southern Wesleyan in the Admissions Office. Mandi serves as volunteer specialist for Mission Hospital, also located in Asheville, N.C.

INAUGURATES VOSS
AS 18TH PRESIDENT

Dr. Todd S. Voss, inaugurated Oct. 26 as Southern Wesleyan University's 18th president, shared the vision of a purpose-driven university radically pursuing the call to produce leaders of virtue and vision.

The Inauguration Ceremony, which took place at Newton Hobson Chapel on the university's campus in Central, featured official greetings from representatives of the university's student body, staff and faculty, as well as alumni and community leaders. Also in attendance were college and university presidents and other representatives of higher education, including members of the Voss family.

The event was celebrated with musical selections from the university's concert choir and wind ensemble.

"Southern Wesleyan now has a culture of 'yes,' a culture of 'can do,' and a culture of empowerment which has penetrated and permeated all areas of the campus, including academics," said Dr. Walt Sinnamon, dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at SWU, in his remarks during the ceremony.

"We've already witnessed thrilling evidence of change and innovation taking place here and are eagerly anticipating the future."

"We've already witnessed thrilling evidence of change and innovation taking place here and are eagerly anticipating the future," said Christian Flinchum, president of Southern Wesleyan's Student Government Association, adding that it's an exciting time to be a student.

"The beneficiary of the tenure of Dr. Voss at this university will be the community as a whole," said Central Mayor Mac Martin, commending Voss for his integral role in cooperative efforts between the town and the university to improve the overall quality of life.

The inauguration speaker was Dr. Paul A. Rader, former worldwide leader of the Salvation Army and former president of Asbury College in Wilmore, Ky. Rader said that being a college president and part of a Christ-centered community of learners is "an incredibly exhilarating and privileged role."

"This occasion challenges not only our president but all of us to a higher standard of faithfulness to walk worthy of the vocation to

which we have been called, enriched by the past, drawn in hope toward the future, and rejoicing in the privilege of this present hour. What a time to be alive,” Rader said.

Dr. Jo Anne Lyon, general superintendent of The Wesleyan Church, presented the installation litany. Rev. Russell Gunsalus, executive director of education and clergy development for The Wesleyan Church, along with Dr. Charles Joiner, chairman of the university’s board of trustees, presented Voss with the presidential hood and medallion representing Southern Wesleyan University’s colors and seal.

Voss was named president of Southern Wesleyan in 2011 following the retirement of Dr. David Spittal, who served the university for 17 years. Spittal, who was being inaugurated as the fifth president of MidAmerica Nazarene University that same day, conveyed his greetings in a video during the ceremony.

Prior to becoming president, Voss served as executive vice president at Indiana Wesleyan University. He served at IWU for more than 20 years, first joining the staff as vice president for student development. He had previously served on the staff of West Virginia University, Western Michigan University and Michigan State University.

Special guests for the Oct. 26 inauguration of President Voss were presented with an original handmade stoneware dish crafted by claysmith Rob Gentry, a local artisan based in Pendleton, S.C.

The beautiful blue-glazed dishes were each hand-thrown and detailed by Gentry out of a stoneware clay, then fired in a kiln that he designed. He then applied a glaze before the dish was fired once more, resulting in a unique blue finish.



Rob Gentry Pottery was established in 1983, just a few miles from the historic town of Pendleton, S.C. and Southern Wesleyan University. As one of South Carolina's great professional artisans, Gentry continues his journey of creative discovery using a medium that is limited only by one's imagination. He is part of a small, but growing artisan community in the Pendleton area.

Gentry experienced the potter's art for the first time as a young boy of 12, sitting before a Japanese master. More than 40 years later, his studio produces a diverse array of original clay works. He is also noted for his hand-thrown bathroom sinks, stoneware aquariums and creative light fixtures that offer a unique twist on a traditional function.

As Gentry nears the 30th anniversary of his pottery studio, he feels blessed that he has been able to follow his passion, and to live a career of creativity. Gentry's work was featured in the 1998 Southern Living touring home, the Wrenn house.



His tile works, which include murals, mirrors and counters, are found in homes and public buildings throughout the Southeast. His platters have been used by governors, universities, corporations and private businesses as gifts and awards both nationally and internationally.

Dr. Julie R. Voss, sister of SWU President Todd Voss, is assistant professor of English and coordinator of the American Studies Program at Lenoir-Rhyne University. Voss earned bachelor's degrees in English and psychology from Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Mich.; a master's degree in English from Claremont Graduate University, Claremont, Calif.; and a Ph.D. in English from the University of Kentucky.

Voss discovered she loved to teach and she realized gifts she had as an educator. When Voss decided to pursue a Ph.D., she joined the faculty of a liberal arts college, setting the course for her higher education career. She was recently appointed as director of general education at Lenoir-Rhyne and will assume her new post in January 2013.

Voss was born when her older brother, Todd, was a teenager. She remembers how Todd liked to sit on the motorcycle in the driveway with her seated in front of him. She said he hoped the combination of motorcycle and baby would be irresistible to the neighborhood girls. She remembered how Todd was a good sport, taking in stride numerous tricks played on him by his siblings and, later, his own children. She added that Todd often had enough tricks of his own to play in return.

Enabling the discovery of core values found in a business or organization and within each person defines the work of Matthew Voss, son of SWU President Todd Voss. As customer relations manager at the Soderquist Center, located at John Brown University near Fayetteville, Ark., Voss works to build relationships with business and organizational leaders from across the United States and Canada.

Voss earned a bachelor's degree in marketing and business administration from Indiana Wesleyan University and a MBA in Entrepreneurship at Ball State University. He then spent a year working for Global Partners, a ministry of The Wesleyan Church, in

Indianapolis before entering the private sector to lead in business development for a software company. Five years later, Voss joined the Soderquist Center.

"In everything we do, our tagline is 'values matter,'" Voss said. "If we're going to work with individual leaders in the coaching process, we'll help that leader better understand the core of who they are, what the company's core values are, and how to create alignment between individuals and their company's core values."

Voss said he learned about culture and people in general from growing up in an academic atmosphere. "When I was in college I felt like I'd been in college 18 years of my life," Voss said, noting that he and his family often ate in the college cafeteria and attended practically every event on campus.

Voss says he learned significantly from observing his father's leadership style, observing his approach to complex, often daunting issues, and trying to understand all sides instead of making a rash decision. "I've seen snippets of it around the kitchen table," he said. "Talking about different situations with students or staff or different things – hearing how much he valued relationships with people – students, faculty, staff – his style and approach to leadership is something I've always valued."

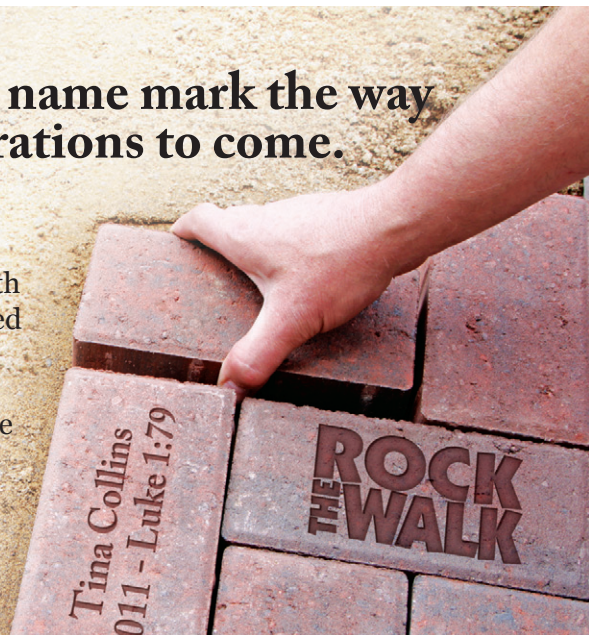

SWU MARKS 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF RESIDENCE HALL TRAGEDY

McDonald Hall was built in 1941 – the first major building project on the campus in Central for 25 years. Third-floor rooms were completed in 1944. The East Wing of McDonald was completed in 1953.

In the fall of 1962, there were only about 150 college students on the campus of Central Wesleyan College. On Dec. 7, 1962, the quietness of the night was broken shortly before 2 a.m. when cries of “Fire!” were heard through McDonald Hall and soon across the campus. Students began alerting others and rushing from the building. Most of the students did not even grab a coat to protect them from the frigid night. There were 56 students and three staff members living there at the time. As the cries of alarm raced through the building, most were able to evacuate without difficulty.

As the students huddled outside or hurried to the warmth of Childs Hall, there came a realization that two of the students were not present. A frantic search began to see if Crystal Bennett or Myrna Stuart could be located. Students made an attempt to enter the burning building to see if they could reach the rooms of these two girls. However, that part of the building — the third floor of the west wing — was fully ablaze and there was no way to get into that area. Crystal’s brother Gordon Bennett and other students tried. Academic Dean Claude Rickman and Dean of Students Paul Wood tried, but could not reach that area. Wood tells that he practically had to force Dr. Rickman from the building. Others tried to climb the fire escape or to throw objects at the windows in hopes of alerting the girls, but it was too late.

Firemen from Central and other surrounding areas came and made a valiant effort to contain the fire,

despite cold temperatures and limited water pressure. However, even ideal conditions would not have saved the building, or the two lives.

Students were sent home right after the fire, a week early for Christmas break. The semester’s schedule was pushed back a week in order to complete classes and finals by Feb. 2. During a memorial service at First Wesleyan Church (now ALIVE Wesleyan Church) on Jan. 6, the campus came together to grieve and to remember those two lives. Members of the Bennett and Stuart families attended. They mourned their losses, but expressed appreciation to the entire campus for all that had been done to help them.

The response to the fire was a dramatic outpouring of support from the local community and beyond. A number of civic organizations offered help in many forms, donating clothing and replacing eyeglasses, books and other necessities. This tragedy brought national attention literally overnight to the quiet school on the hill outside Central.

The campus leadership team quickly decided that a new residence hall would be built with the name of Stuart-Bennett Hall. Within weeks, an architectural plan was approved. Financing, through insurance, gifts and fund-raising was planned. Construction on the new building began in late March. Stuart-Bennett Hall, with three floors plus a basement, was ready for use when the students came to campus on Sept. 18, 1963. It had taken less than six months to erect the building. Two more floors were added in 1967, bringing Stuart-Bennett to its current appearance.

SWU GRAD WINS SILVER AT WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Lindsey Torgerson won a silver medal at the 2012 ITU Long Course Duathlon World Championships in Zofingen, Switzerland Sept. 2. She endured six miles of running, a 90-mile bike ride, and another 18-mile run.

Torgerson is fitness director at Gold's Gym in Fayetteville, N.C. Since graduating with a business degree from Southern Wesleyan University in 2009, Torgerson, who played for the volleyball team and the 2007 NCCAA championship women's basketball team, felt the need to compete again athletically. Working full-time and playing with a club team wasn't an option, so she explored the alternatives.

"A friend recommended that I compete in a duathlon," Torgerson said. "I bought a bike on Craigslist and entered myself into races."

Torgerson began to focus on running and cycling, entering competitions where possible. As she gained experience in training and increased her distance, she took the competition to higher levels. In May 2012, Torgerson entered the Black Water Duathlon National Championship in Maryland – a combination of six miles of running, 60 miles of bicycling and another six-mile run at the end.

"I didn't feel I did as well, and when we left I thought I didn't qualify," Torgerson said. Then she received a call from a competition official that she qualified for the World Championships in September.



Arriving in Switzerland, Torgerson was impressed by the breathtaking scenery, and although the mountainous course took her breath away in a more real sense, she finished second in the 25-29 age group.

“The morning started out cold, windy and rainy,” said Torgerson, adding that running uphill on a 16 percent incline and battling buffeting winds were challenging.

“If you finish, it’s an accomplishment in itself – it’s grueling. Three quarters of the biking is going uphill,” she said. At the end of the cycling segment, Torgerson felt barely able to even walk with her bike.

“When I got off the bike my back cramped up and I was thinking, ‘How am I going to get through this?’” she said. Torgerson worked through her pain and continued the duathlon with an 18-mile run.

“Honestly, it’s almost like the pain numbs away and all your focus is on finishing,” she said. “Right at the finish when you know you are about to finish, it’s beautiful. You’re in the Alps and you see the views.”

Torgerson said she enjoyed her first trip to Europe and getting to know the others on Team USA.



“I had been to South America and the Caribbean. Switzerland is clean. Everyone spoke English so you could get around without knowing another language. Everyone rides bikes and there are few cars. There are places to park bikes and bike paths everywhere,” Torgerson said, adding that the Swiss drive cars that are tiny compared to the typical American vehicle.

“I consider myself very lucky. It all kind of happened. I learned a lot through Coach Chris Williams about preparation. If you don’t prepare and set realistic goals you’re never going to go anywhere you want to go,” said Torgerson, grateful she’s been able to apply what she learned – hard work and discipline – as a Warrior. She also learned about priorities and the place God has in her life.

Torgerson also gives credit to her father, Dr. Brian Torgerson, who passed away recently, for being very supportive throughout her experiences in athletic competition, and she continues to enjoy the support of her mother, Candace. More recently, Torgerson competed Nov. 11 in the Miami Man Half Iron Triathlon, where she won first place for her age group.

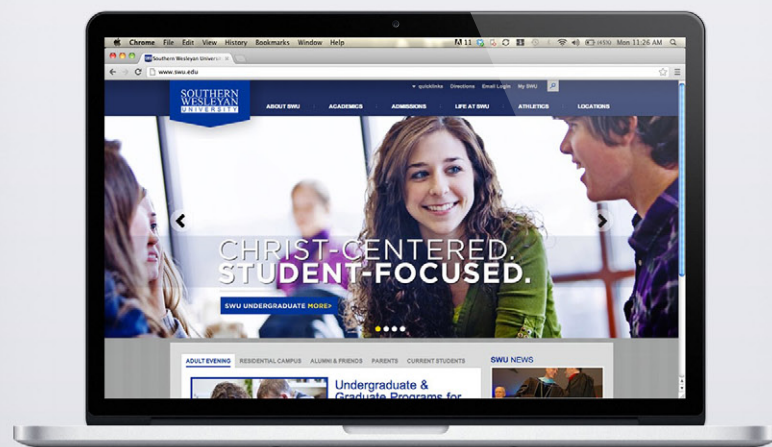

COLUMBIA STUDENT INSPIRES, PROMOTES POWER OF EDUCATION

Dwayne Ismail, a student at Southern Wesleyan University's Columbia Education Center, isn't afraid to confront issues that lead youth down a dead-end road.

A loving grandmother, and his single mother, Joanna McCray, with assistance of others, helped Ismail navigate his own troubled youth, lived out on the streets of Miami. Now, he shows a younger generation of at-risk youth how to take the right road.

"I'd get into trouble in Miami and was shipped to Manning, S.C., to work for my grandfather," he said. Ismail aspired to make his name as a rap music recording artist, but when he got married and became a father, he knew he would need to change his lifestyle.

"It was difficult to be in Miami and stay focused," Ismail said, adding that his grandmother recommended he move to Manning. Ismail moved to South Carolina to be near his relatives in Clarendon County and reconnect with his father, Johnnie Taylor. He currently resides in Columbia with his wife, Shelly, daughters Chardonnay and Briahna and his son, William.

Another pivotal event came in 2008 when Ismail attended a community meeting where then-Attorney General Henry McMaster challenged him to get involved with youth. He responded by developing a program called Business Leaders Youth Alliance, an organization that connects business leaders with at-risk youth, offering them learning opportunities through real-life examples.

Ismail speaks to middle and high school students, urging them to finish school and aim for college. He frequently partners not only with other business professionals, but also leaders in local government and law enforcement.

"Dwayne is one of our up and coming community leaders and contributors," said Sam Davis, a member of Columbia's city council, adding that Ismail works with him on crime, safety and other youth issues in his district. "He's willing to go beyond the 8 to 5."

A few years ago, when Ismail visited Phoenix Charter School in Alcolu, he encouraged Maryann Llera, then a high school student, to stick with her dream. Ismail's mentoring helped her attain academic success and to graduate from high school as class valedictorian in 2010.

"To this day he keeps me on track," said Llera, who currently lives in Texas and continues her studies in forensic science while serving as a member of the National Guard's military police.

Another success story is Aaron Nelson, a student from Kingstree, who periodically interns with Ismail at the Dessausure Law Firm in Columbia, where he assists in creating packages for clients, faxing and copying. Former Turbeville Town Manager Pat Goodwin mentored an East Clarendon High School student, making him town manager for a week. During that period the student worked with engineers on a streetscape project, introduced an ordinance at a town council meeting and attended a Rotary meeting.

Also, BLYA celebrated its first Juris Doctorate when Tiffany Michelle Jones was accepted into the Alabama State Bar in October.

Ismail takes to heart that same message he shares with others valuing a good education. He attends classes at Southern Wesleyan's Columbia Education Center at 1021 Pinnacle Point Drive, located near his home. Ismail's goal is to someday earn his business degree. "I love it. I recommend it. I'm trying to recruit," Ismail enthusiastically said. "The program gives us working adults a chance."

Ever sharpening his skill, Ismail recently won first-place at a conference for District 58 of Toastmasters International, an organization that develops communication and leadership skills.

"Toastmasters fine tunes your communication skills and develops the leader inside of you," Ismail said, adding that he'd like to see his other SWU classmates become involved with Toastmasters.

REMEMBERING TRAVIS

Eiler was tragically murdered while serving in Central Asia Dec. 2, 2011. During the service, Warriors Cross Country Coach Chip Rouse reflected on Eiler's years as a student-athlete and Williams dedicated his memorial. Teammate Nick Hindes spoke in tribute to Eiler; teammate Meg Donaldson shared scripture and Rev. Ken Dill, university chaplain, led in a committal. Eric and Danielle Eiler, Travis' parents, spread some of his ashes along the course. According to Dill, most of his ashes were scattered at the beach where he used to run. The plaque was placed on a hill at the course's toughest spot as an encouragement to runners – just as Travis encouraged his teammates.

SWU ATHLETICS REACHES NCAA CAMPAIGN GOAL

As Southern Wesleyan University moves forward with efforts to better the quality of its athletic program, an important financial goal has been reached.

The university has raised the \$150,000 needed to make the transition and apply for an NCAA Division II program through pledges and gifts of many supporters.

Chris Williams, athletic director at Southern Wesleyan, feels this is an important step in efforts to build the athletic program and improve the institution's visibility in intercollegiate athletics and enrollment. Williams is confident that the university will meet the Feb. 1 deadline for a required strategic plan and application.

"We are positioned to now move forward with our overall athletic strategic plan, field expansion and new sport development at the same time we complete our NCAA application. Warrior Athletics to add Four New Sports in 2013

Men's and Women's Track and Field, along with Men's and Women's Tennis

The Southern Wesleyan University board of trustees has unanimously voted in favor of the addition of four new intercollegiate sports teams: men's and women's track and field and men's and women's tennis. The teams will begin competition in 2013-2014.

"I am excited that the board has approved the addition of these four sports," said SWU director of athletics Chris Williams. "The addition of track and tennis will only add to momentum here at SWU."

A national search for the head coaching positions of the track and field teams and the tennis teams will begin immediately. SWU is looking to continue to push the enrollment growth of the university, while also being able to give the student-athletes a first-class experience of competing in intercollegiate athletics.

This move will also increase the exciting interest at the University to make application with the NCAA on February 1, 2013. The track and field teams will also help bolster the successful women and men's cross country programs at SWU.

FUNDING FOR NEW TRACK TO BE SOUGHT FOR TRACK AND FIELD TEAMS

The Southern Wesleyan University board of trustees has voted in favor of building a state-of-the-art track facility on SWU's main campus.

The site for the new track will be where the current intramural fields are located just off of S.C. Highway 93.

"The approval of the track is the start of a huge strategic plan," stated SWU director of athletics Chris Williams. "I am excited for the future of Warrior Athletics."

The track will be an Olympic style surface, and with near future plans for bleachers and lighting, it will also be the new home for Warriors soccer once the inside of the track area is completed. A large portion

of the funding has already been established, with the remainder coming from gifts.

"This will be just the beginning for this site as we start a strategic process of moving all of our varsity fields and facilities to this new, very visible location near the entrance to campus," says Dr. Todd Voss, University President. "Our goal is to secure the needed funding soon to start construction this year."

Varsity Field, SWU softball's home facility, will also see a new facelift as a new concession area and bathrooms will be built. Construction on the new building will begin as soon as drawings are complete with anticipated completion just prior to the softball season.

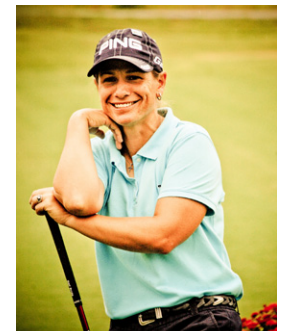
SWUPER SATURDAY BENEFITS GOLF FACILITY

CHRISTIAN HIGHER EDUCATION AT CRITICAL CROSSROADS

Christian higher education is at a critical crossroads.

The entire landscape of higher education, and Christian higher education in particular, is changing at such a rapid pace that the presidents of these institutions must both plan and act with a sense of serious urgency.

It is crucial for Christian higher education to lead, because it was Christian schools founded on faith which set the standard for educational excellence in this country. For scores of years, the pursuit of truth and integration of faith and learning were the cornerstone of education. Students were provided rigorous academics while discovering their calling and receiving the empowerment needed to serve society with a conviction that had a distinctive outcome. The most recognizable institutions in the nation were founded on such principles.

As the demand for higher education increased, the emphasis on faith and calling eroded. This great American tragedy continues today.

For the good of all, institutions of Christian higher education must radically pursue the intentionally Christian path if we hope to strengthen what remains and follow our calling. It is time to unapologetically promote, with passion and purpose, a superior way for students to discover their calling while building a new era of influential universities based on the foundation of biblical truth.

The timing is critical. A recession coupled with accelerating governmental intrusion into the business of higher education could have potentially devastating consequences on Christian campuses across the country.

To distance ourselves from these circumstances, Christian higher education must become self-sustaining by moving away from the outside influences with our scholarships and operating costs. We must develop new and great processes, culture and services that continue to generate growth, prosperity and independence from a governmental bureaucracy and economy that continues to create uncertainty.

This will not be easy. Financial aid systems, presumptuous legislation, required compliance and government agencies are not designed to support this kind of independent thinking. Yet Christian colleges believe in a God that owns it all already; a God who

has given us a great platform and great people, and we have solid evidence to trust in the incredible potential to realize this possibility at such a time as this.

We all recognize the challenges facing higher education. Spiraling tuition and fees, reduced state and federal aid, massive technology costs, significant facility needs, troublesome searches for specialized faculty and adapting to new delivery modalities, to name a few. We also know it is not how many students start college that matters, but how many complete it and achieve something better because of it. In great part, our success will be measured by this expectation and our future will clearly depend on it.

To face these challenges, a radical pursuit of a purpose-driven university will be built heavily on innovation. More than that, Christian higher education must lead the way to new avenues of spiritual commitment and character development, new methods of delivery, new vanguard curriculum and programs, and new opportunities for excellence and service. Our expectations are, and should be, great because they come from a higher authority.

We must not only celebrate the development of new ideas, but move such ideas quickly to campus conversations and quick implementation. Most Christian colleges have streamlined organizational advantages, with flexibility and rapid response often at the top. We have an opportunity to be more nimble and responsive than most campuses because of our size, our mission and our eagerness and belief in what we do. Such faith will prove to be significant in the quest for growth and independence.

Our radical pursuit of being a purpose-driven university must define us. Any college can commit to instill knowledge, but only a few can instill the Christian character and the understanding of calling, that equips students to help them use knowledge well. Purpose-driven means our students will be trained to be servant leaders since they will be the ones who determine the future quality of our homes, schools, churches, businesses, government and the world.

In the history of Christianity, when it engaged with the world for change, past evidence clearly shows education was the key. Christian higher education holds that key and needs to boldly and radically step forward to take a prominent position in that role and responsibility. Time is of the essence.

SWU TO BEGIN ONLINE DEGREES IN FEBRUARY

Southern Wesleyan University has been offering flexible programs to working adults for 25 years, but new fully-online programs are about to take flexibility to the next level.

The Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools recently approved online versions of the associate of arts in general studies and bachelor of science in business administration degrees. According to Dr. Keith Iddings, university provost, both online degree programs will become available in early 2013.

Online versions of additional graduate and undergraduate programs will be offered in the not-too-distant future, according to Iddings.

“First and foremost, we thank God for this game changing approval,” said University President Todd Voss upon receiving the news of SACS approval. “This initiative has been bathed in prayer for months and months – what an answer.”

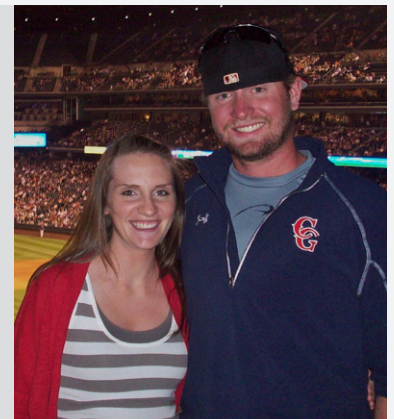

STUDENTS

Bart Cone, a computer science student, placed 79th among contestants from around the world in a computer security competition Sept. 29 and 30. He competed in CSAW CTF, a competition of challenges designed to solve technical security challenges. While most contestants in the field of 240 in the undergraduate category were teams, Cone competed solo, a particularly impressive feat, considering he outranked teams from MIT and Clemson University.

Nick Shear, a transfer student from Rockford, Mich. and member of the SWU Men's Cross Country Team, completed Ironman Wisconsin Sept. 9. He placed 26th in the Men's 18-24 age group with a time of 12 hr., 18 min. and 9 sec., enduring a 2.4 mile swim, followed by 112 miles of bicycling and then running a full marathon at 26.2 miles. "Hard as it is, it's probably one of the most incredible feelings to go across the finish line," said Shear.

FACULTY AND STAFF

Debbie G. Brownfield, an adjunct professor at SWU in Charleston, published "Secrets of the Enemy," a novel in which two couples race against time to prevent the simultaneous destruction of 13 hit sites in America by terrorists. 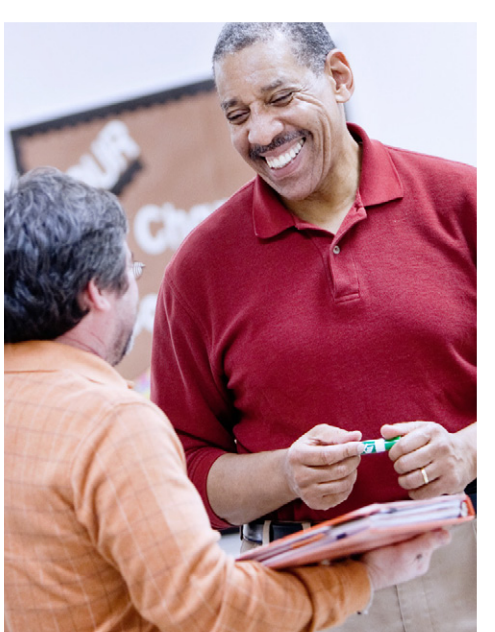
